#### **Planning**

Probably the most controversial plans locally are the development of the green strip of land between St Margaret's Way and Kingcup Avenue. Also the total development of land stretching from the Maylands Industrial area to the fields on the east of the village stretching as far as those opposite The Centurion Club.

The St Margaret's Way development has been proposed and approved over several years and work has commenced. This is despite many objections from residents and from the Village Association. There will ultimately be a total of 46 new dwellings in the form of apartments and terraced houses. We are assured that the development will be mitigated by areas of grassland and newly planted trees but, overall, the plans are now too far advanced for any major changes to be made.

The other major development is the land to the east of the village. Plans were first put forward in 2014 by St Albans City and District Council (SADC) to build 1,100 homes on the Green Belt fields extending from Breakspear Way to a line roughly following the village boundary. In 2016 the Planning Inspector threw out the plans on the grounds that St Albans had failed to cooperate with neighbouring authorities. SADC subsequently lost a High Court Appeal and were forced to go back to the drawing board.

During 2018 they published a new local plan with an increased ambition of building 2,400 new homes on land stretching as far as the fields opposite The Centurion Club. In November 2020 the plan was again thrown out by the Inspector for failure to cooperate with neighbouring authorities. SADC subsequently decided to withdraw the plan and start again on a new draft. As of February 2023 they are still awaiting an updated Green Belt review and a new draft plan is unlikely to emerge before 2024 or 2025.

During this time Dacorum Borough Council has published plans for the Hemel Garden Communities which proposes development from The Marchmont Arms right round the north and east of Hemel Hempstead to join up or even overlap the St Albans plan. Sooner or later, despite many objections from residents and LGVA we are likely to see major development over this area. The present target date for completion is 2050.

#### Planning continued



The dotted white line marks the DBC/SADC boundary while the solid white line marks the proposed extent of Hemel Garden Communities.

The only other major development in the area is the new cemetery and crematorium adjacent to Bunkers Park. The cemetery was necessary as DBC's original site at Woodwells is almost full and the crematorium at Garston could not cope with numbers without long delays. The cemetery was a DBC project while the crematorium was overseen by Watford Borough Council.

#### **Cultivating with Clive**

All of us must have realised by now that a lot of our natural insects and pollinators are in serious decline. In fact, bumblebees alone who are vital for the pollination of crops, garden plants and wildflowers have suffered huge declines over the past century. Two species have become extinct in the past 80 years and eight species are now endangered.

Some of us older residents will remember in the summer when it was time to clean the car on a Sunday, the amount of elbow grease we had to use to remove all the squashed bugs that had accumulated on the window screen. Have you ever wondered why we don't have to do this anymore?

What can we do about this? Well, there is plenty we can all do. Whether you have a small window box or a large garden. We can all help by following a few simple tasks.

Why not plant at least two types of plants or shrubs that will produce pollen for the insects for each season. You could try Crocus, California Lilac, Pieris or Dicentra for the insects to feed from in the Spring. In the Summer why not try Viper's Bugloss, Lavender, Geraniums and my favourite,



Foxgloves. In the autumn you could try Verbena, Sunflower, Cosmos and Honeysuckle. This will give the insects enough food to last the year.

Apart from the above. I am in the process of creating a wild garden. I have a patch of grass at the side of my house in Leverstock Green which I am converting to a wild meadow. Firstly, I pegged down some old cardboard which I obtained from the local recycling centre or tip, as some people like to call it. I then covered the cardboard in poor quality

topsoil. This you can buy from B&Q or garden centres. I then sprinkled

some wildflower seeds on the topsoil and raked it in.

I made sure the soil didn't dry out and hey presto the wildflower seeds germinated bringing in all sorts of insects to the meadow.

If you have children, why not get them involved? They could help by sprinkling the seeds and watering them. Then spending an hour a week monitoring the insects, how



many bees, beetles, earwigs etc. and make a list to keep them involved. It would help the future generations be aware of what responsibility we all have to the biodiversity of our Village, country and indeed the planet.



#### **Welcome to Bunkers Park**

Bunkers Park, as we know it today, started in 1995 when Dacorum Borough Council acquired the land from the Commission for New Towns (later known as English Partnerships). Prior to this the land had been farmed for many centuries with maps from 1877 showing the field boundaries. The hedgerows along the edges of the park are thought to date back to the 10<sup>th</sup> century and locally there is evidence of an Iron Age farmstead just to the south west of the Park.

With the land in the possession of the Council and following work carried out by the Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust, plans were put together in 1997 to identify a vision for the future open space. The Management Plan was finalized by the end of that year and in February 1998, with the help of 200 local residents and 600 local school children, Chambersbury Wood was planted in the fields on the northern side of the Park. The planting was so successful that, 12 years later, it became necessary to thin out some of the trees to allow others to develop to their full potential. The Park presently extends to 123 acres and, together with Long Deans, forms a leisure area and nature reserve to the east of Hemel Hempstead. During 2023 it will be extended to include two fields on the south side of Bunkers Lane, shown on the map as Pond Field and Long Saunders. Until 2022 these fields were leased by DBC to a local farmer. The land forms a natural boundary to development and is part of the Green Belt surrounding the town.

Some of the original field names remain while others such as Bunkers

Common and White Field are now known as Bottom Field, Chambersbury Wood is where Winchdells and Hill Field used to be. Mattens are the fenced pastures in the fields once called Winchdells and Rumballs and are now home during summer months to a small herd of Belted Galloway cows.

Friends of Bunkers Park is a group of volunteers formed of local residents who help to manage the Park's growth and generally keep a watchful eye on its development. The group meets once during most months to coppice the hazel, lay hedges and generally maintain undergrowth to provide a varied habitat for the Park's natural residents. They occasionally hold a litter pick and generally strive to make the Park a welcome place for its many visitors. #### Leverstock Green Football Club

Leverstock Green Football Club was formed around 1895. The first match reports appeared on January 4th 1896 in the Advertiser and gave an account of a match against Hemel Hempstead Rovers.


The first competitive fixtures were reported during season 1908/1909 when the Club competed in Division Three of the West Herts League. Other clubs competing in the league at that time were: Abbots Langley, Bovingdon, Boxmoor, Bushey Heath, Hagden Lane, Kings Langley and Potten End. The Club ground in Pancake Lane originally formed part of



the Gorhambury Estate, Lord Verulam making the ground available for the youth of the area and his estate workers to enjoy a game of ball. Clearly Lord Verulam was an early enthusiast, providing timber-built changing rooms, which have been progressively replaced since the 1960's by the existing brick built clubhouse and changing rooms.

We are currently playing in the Spartan South Midlands League Premier Division.

In 2022 the Men's First Team won the top division of the Watford and District Tennis League for the 4th consecutive year.



#### Charity Commission no. 302421



#### More Rubbish....!

Hemel Hempstead and the villages that surround the town centre are facing specific challenges with litter which are increasing year-on-year. There is no one cause – there are many factors: Hemel has numerous light industrial areas attracting out-of-town commuters & commercial vehicles; close proximity to trunk roads & motorways; unlit roads & lay-bys; side roads & country lanes used as "cut-throughs"; population increase; lack of deterrents......

Fly-tipping incidents reported in Dacorum have almost doubled from 832 in 2012-13 to 1,587 in 2021-22.

I have found everything ranging from a three-piece sofa with chairs to a full bathroom suite and even a cannabis air-filtration filter with burnt-out plants! We know resources are stretched, so what can we do to help? In terms of reducing fly-tipping, please ensure that any contractor you use to dispose of your waste holds a Waste Carriers Licence.

Fly-tipping can also be reported on Dacorum Council's website.

There are now over 1,000 registered "litter pickers" of the Dacorum Street Champions, including entire families, many registered on the Facebook Group. If you are interested in signing up, please go to www.dacorum.gov.uk/street-champions. You will also be provided with the necessary kit.

There are a number of litter pickers in the Leverstock Green area – from Three Cherry Trees Lane in the north to Bunkers Lane in the south. Please join us!
