
# John Baldwin

John Baldwin, who passed away on 23rd May aged 86, was a long-standing trustee and committee member of the LGVA. After a career in the Police Service, John and Yvonne moved to Leverstock Green in September 2001. For over 22 years, he worked tirelessly for the good of the village, and his many achievements will be his lasting legacy.

John was responsible for maintaining and updating the LGVA website, and he also organised the installation of an illuminated information screen at the front of the Village Hall. He was involved in the production of the old village newsletter and in proof-reading the new 'Village Voice' magazine. He was also a regular winner of the best photograph competition!

In 2016, John arranged the replacement of the wooden village sign which after 16 years was showing its age. The new hand-painted sign

is made of polyurethane which is better able to withstand the British climate. The old sign was repainted and mounted on the wall in the Village Hall.



Throughout his time with the LGVA, John was a member of the Environment and Planning Sub Committee preparing evidence to challenge Local Plans and objecting to planning applications which were not in the best interests of the village as a whole.

He campaigned successfully to have a 40mph speed limit imposed on the dangerous stretch of Bedmond Road between the Leverstock Green and Pimlico. He also worked with Councillors on a long-running campaign to extend the car park at the side of the Hall and to introduce a 2 hour time limit on parking in front of the shops.

During Covid many children painted individual stones which were laid to form a snake. After the pandemic 'Sid the Snake' was in danger of being lost, and John assisted local Councillors in establishing a permanent home for the art installation alongside the play park on Westwick Field.

John was a leading volunteer for both the Summer Fete and the Winter Fayre. He was one of the few who could erect a marquee with aplomb, and for many years was the Fete MC on the public address system.


He was actively involved with the 'Friends of Bunkers Park' and helped to organise the teams which carry out regular maintenance and coppicing. In recent years, he liaised with the Boxmoor Trust to host each summer a number of Belted Galloway cattle on the pastures of Bunkers Park. John also introduced and maintained the rota of volunteers who carry out a daily check on the well-being of the cows.

John has been described as 'a lovely man with a great sense of humour'. He was part of the fabric of Leverstock Green, and his presence will be sorely missed.

His funeral took place on 17th June at Hemel Hempstead Crematorium which he had monitored during construction on behalf of the LGVA!

#### Leverstock Green School Vision

There has been a church school in Leverstock Green since 1840. Church schools were originally set up with a deed of trust to serve and educate the children of the parish within the context of the Christian ethos. As times have changed, so the obligations on church schools have changed. We welcome families of all faiths and no faith and believe we can give all our children a more enriching experience by celebrating our similarities and differences.

One of the things church schools are obliged to do is have a vision statement which sets out how we want our school to be. Every so often, we return to it with parents, pupils, staff and governors to make sure it is still right for our current context. # Up The Trees LORDS Builders Merchants Stadium

Well, well well, where do I start, what a whirlwind season this has been, especially the second half of the season. Most of you would have read my Christmas report which gave a sum up of the first half of the season where we said goodbye to Dean, We welcomed a new Development side, The first team started their season strong remaining in the top of the table, We welcomed new managers to the club and work off the pitch continued as always. Fast forward, to the end of the season and how do I sum this one up.

#### On the Pitch

The weather after Christmas was enough to dampen anyone's mood and it caused so many games to be cancelled and a huge backlog of games towards the end of the season. Games were swapped, Christmas local derbies were called off and we were all left wondering when it would end. Even as I sit here in May, writing this... it's raining.

Some highlights in the second half of the season, MUST be beating Real Bedford at home, the ONLY team to beat them this season, what a win that would end up being. Another Draw with MK Irish and beating two Northampton sides to get into the Gladwish Final. We played Tring twice in 7 days and both games were extremely competitive and saw some really good football played.

April comes around and the end of the season draws in... we're sitting in a play-off position and the games are coming thick and fast. By the middle of April, our playoff position was guaranteed it was now in our hands as to where we would finish. Tring, the last game of the season and we need a win to Finish 3rd and have a home draw in the Semi Final vs Harpenden. They beat us 1-0 and we finished the Season in 4th by goal difference meaning an away Tie in the Semi Final.

On Wednesday 1st May we travelled to Harpenden with a crowd of 917, a good mix of Harps and Levy fans and went into the game with the mindset of what happens happens, we were proud of the achievement. I said it many times that night, if someone had told me we would be sitting here at the play offs I would have pinched myself. We went 1-0 up after 4 minutes and then quickly made it 2-0 before half time, each and every one of those lads putting 150% into their game. Harps came out strong in the second half and looked like they could get one back, but super-sub Beckwith had other ideas and a 3rd goal went in. Harps score a goal, and the last 10 minutes go by slow... whistle goes and the celebrations start, we had made it into the Play Off Final, this would end up being at home to FC Romania who beat MK Irish 3-0.

After an extremely hard 4 days of organizing, Monday 6th May arrived, and we welcomed 914 people into Pancake Lane on a very very wet day. What a game this would turn out to be. The rain made the pitch difficult to play on so long balls and not much fancy football was the key to this one. We took the lead and then another... and then another. We were 3-0 and it suddenly hit me what that meant.

The final whistle goes, and we had done it... Little Old Levy have been promoted to Step 4 Football. For the first time in Leverstock Green history, we were playing Step 4!! The celebrations continued well into the night and the boys truly deserved this as they have put so much into it this season.

But we weren't finished there, we travelled to Harpenden Town on 11th May to face London Lions in the Gladwish Final which saw us go 1-0 down early on before coming back and winning 4-1. We had done the double, but we also said goodbye to the Legend that is Paul Marks as he retires from playing.

And still we were not done, on Friday 17th May we travelled to Hemel FC to face Harpenden once again in the St Mary's Cup Final where we hoped to retain the trophy. We went 1-0 up after a penalty but it was a game of lots of missed chances for Leverstock and great goalkeeping by the Harpenden Keeper. A hattrick from Jake Anthony, took away the chance of a Treble for Levy and Harpenden were crowned Champions of the St Mary's Cup.

Take nothing away from Friday night, the boys have had the best season Leverstock have ever had and each and every one of them and everyone off the pitch deserves this. Next year Levy will play in the Southern League Central Div 1 playing against ex Spartan teams, Kings Langley, Berkhamsted, Stotfold, Leighton and Hadley amongst a few of the teams.

The Development Team stormed ahead with the new management team after a shaky start, they only lost 3 of their last 18 games pushing them up into finishing 8th in the league. This was an outstanding achievement for the management team and the players, showing their abilities and skills. They also had a backlog of games due to the weather and with some of the players stepping up from the under 18's this caused some of the players to be playing 4 times in 5 days! But they continued to fight and dug in deep to finish the season strongly.

I am very happy to say we are continuing with the team next season all be it they will now be Leverstock Green Reserves and we will continue to grow the under 18's into men's football and push them to the first team.

The under 18's continued to push against some very tough opposition this season and over the season took some losses that were worthy of wins. They faced some tough issues this year and were put through their paces with difficulties on and off the pitch. A huge highlight was welcoming Kings Langley to Levy and beating them 4-1 in a very tough contested game. The lads continued to push themselves in every game with at least 6 of them stepping up to the Development games on a regular basis.

Unfortunately, Aaron, Dan and Dan will be leaving us this year and taking a step away from management. I truly cannot thank these guys enough for all the time and effort they have given the club this year. Three great people who fitted into the club's ethos from the get-go. I wish you all the luck in the world.

# **Planning**

St Albans City and District Council (SADC) carried out its Regulation 18 consultation on a new draft Local Plan 2041 in September 2023. This was followed in October, by a Regulation 18 consultation by Dacorum Borough Council (DBC) on its own draft Local Plan 2024-2040. The two Plans include the Hemel Garden Communities (HGC) project which will contribute to a major expansion of Hemel Hempstead. The aim of the HGC is to build 11,000 houses with associated new infrastructure and create 10,000 new jobs by 2050. Some 5,500 of these new homes will be constructed in the St Albans Council area on land owned by The Crown Estate. Around 3,100 of these houses will be in areas north of Maylands whereas 2,400 homes are proposed for an area to the south of Junction 8 of the M1 adjacent to Leverstock Green. The DBC Local Plan includes 80 houses on land south of Green Lane adjacent to Westwick Row.

The two draft Local Plans are proceeding to similar timescales. SADC intends to carry out a further consultation known as Regulation 19 between October and December 2024. This consultation, which will last 6 weeks, is the second stage of the formal process that allows the public to comment on the draft plan before it is submitted to the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government for examination. The consultation includes details of the sites allocated for development and focuses on the Plans soundness and legal compliance as outlined in the National Planning Policy Framework.

SADC aims to submit the updated draft Local Plan for examination by March 2025. An independent Planning Inspector will then be appointed by the Secretary of State to carry out a 'public examination' of the Plan and all the comments submitted during the consultation. SADC envisages this process will be completed by February 2026 with formal adoption of the new Local Plan following in March 2026.

DBC is planning to carry out its Regulation 19 consultation in late 2024 and plans to submit the updated draft Plan to the Secretary of State by mid-2025. Following the public examination, DBC envisages the Plan will be adopted in 2026.


It is not clear to what extent changes to the planning system by the new Government will affect the development of these Local Plans.

DBC and SADC are also actively involved in preparing a Joint Strategic Plan for SW Hertfordshire together with Hertsmere, Three Rivers and Watford councils.

The JSP will provide a long-term blueprint for the area to 2050. It will consider and address issues that cross council boundaries and set out a strategic vision for the area. It will also help to guide future plans

and strategies by setting out high level policies on topics such as climate change, infrastructure, environmental protection, employment and housing.

The five councils working alongside Hertfordshire County Council will together develop the JSP as well as being responsible for preparing their own Local Plans. The key aim of the Plan is to ensure infrastructure such as transport, schools, health provision and utilities is well coordinated and delivered together with new homes and jobs.

Westwick Field behind the shops used to be allotments back in the 1930's.





# **Holy Trinity Church**

Holy Trinity Church Leverstock Green

Following the retirement of Rev Lizzie Hood, we are delighted that The Revd James McDonald, Team Vicar at All Saints Church Kings Langley, has been appointed Rector of the Benefice of Langeli in succession to Lizzie. Father James was inducted as Rector by the Bishop of Hertford in a special afternoon service at his home church in Kings Langley on Sunday 28th July.

Following Father James appointment, we are therefore seeking to appoint a new Team Vicar to the Langelei Team Ministry with prime responsibility for Holy Trinity, Leverstock Green. They will be based in the vicarage in Pancake Lane.

The recruitment process is now well under way. Under guidance from the Diocese and the Rector, the Parochial Church Council of Holy Trinity have produced a" parish profile." This is a comprehensive document which could best be described as a cross between a job description and a travelogue. It sets out the responsibilities of the new incumbent, the qualifications, skills, and experience required in the post and for possible applicants who come from outside the area, a detailed description of the village, the community, and the local vicinity.

The post is being advertised in "The Church Times" at the beginning of September with a closing date for applications early in October. Suitable candidates will then be shortlisted, interviewed, and invited to visit the village to meet with members of the PCC. We would hope to be able to offer the position to the preferred candidate in November. Assuming they have to give notice from their present post, it is anticipated that they will be able to be inducted as the Team Vicar at Holy Trinity early in the New Year.

Meanwhile the church continues very much as normal. Thanks to tremendous help from Father James and our Associate Priest, Revd Jos Perris, helped out by occasional visiting guest vicars and members of the Diocese, we continue to hold Eucharist services every Sunday at 10.00am and most Wednesdays. The Churchwardens and other members of the PCC have also taken on additional responsibilities during the vacancy which has meant that church life has been able to continue much as usual.

The Church is now open every day for private prayer and reflection from 10.00am to 4.00pm and our Saturday morning coffee shop from 10.00am to 12noon continues every week as in the past. All church groups continue to function normally and the Church Social Committee continues to organise the usual range of social events. All village residents are very welcome to attend whether members of the church or not. ## **Bunkers Park**

#### Cow watch in Bunkers Park fields

The early morning mist rises, and the birds are singing as you walk over the damp grass to see Trevor and his ladies in one of three allocated fields in Bunkers Park. Or as evening draws in, you walk slowly through the fields as the light fades, with a slight warm zephyr blowing in your face, as you search for the Belted Gallows settling down for the night.

On a hot day black and white cows can easily hide in the bushes and watch you search for them!

Cow watch has been running for a few years now. The Boxmoor Trust winter their entire herd of Belted Galloway cows in their base by the A41, undercover in barns. But from late spring through to Autumn, weather dependent, groups of these black and white "Pandas" move out to pasture.

One of these small herds summer over in Bunkers Park and I, Roy Makins, liaise with The Trust and Bob Mansbridge running a rota so that at least once a day someone local walks over to check the herd. 6 beasts this year, 5 ladies and Trevor. I took over this pleasure earlier this year from John Baldwin, who had run this since conception until ill health and finally, sadly, his passing earlier this year.

The three fields the cows rotate in are left as nature once was, with wild meadow flowers and grass growing naturally. Trevor and his ladies just add the fertiliser only. The fences have been made good, but now each animal has a tag, a responder, that we can track their position on our phones, but more importantly the invisible fence and the responder keeps them safely inside.

It does look like only 5 were present but by zooming out the sixth is there – phew!





The volunteers, about 14 of us, visit on our rota day, at any time, but often we wander to see our herd on non-rotating days, as this is such a nice experience. We check that their water trough is full and look at the cows to see if they look happy. We aren't vets, but if something doesn't look right, we can call Bob at the Trust. Normally the herd is munching grass, just keeping a wary eye on passersby. Many years ago, wolves were their predators, but with no wolf sightings in Leverstock Green lately, all is safe.

#### **Bunkers Park Continued...**

Cows and dogs do not always mix, and a dog can chase the herd and cause distress to the beasts. So, if you wander across and say hello to our herd, be mindful if you have a dog and keep him or her on a lead, please.



#### **Nature Notes**

#### Nature Notes from My Garden

It's now August and I have completed the Big Butterfly Count three times this year as you can complete it more than once. Compared to my results of last year the species and numbers of each I have seen are down and I'm sure you have all heard the news about our butterflies, moths, bees and other insects disappearing. Habitat loss along with this year's unusually wet and windy spring, coupled with the colder than usual temperatures early summer are thought to be contributing to this. How about having a wild area with nectar loving plants that these insects love to help feed them when they are out on the wing?

It is easy to build an insect hotel to help insects overwinter. Use a milk carton as the basis for your mini bug hotel. 2. Fill in the gaps. Insert bamboo canes, drinking straws and rolled up cardboards into your milk carton. Fill in the remaining space with dry leaves, pebbles, loose bark and other materials. Here are some of the creatures you might find hiding in different parts of your hotel! Loose bark, rotting wood and dry leaves - Centipede, woodlouse and stag beetle. Tubes (hollow stems, bamboo canes and drinking straws) - Bee (Leaf cutter bee, mason bee, solitary bee), ground beetle and garden spider. Straw - Lacewing, devil's coach-horse. Stones and tiles - Smooth newt, frog. Dry leaves - Ladybird. Corrugated cardboard - Earwig, lacewing.

I was lucky to have the Ringlet butterflies back in my garden this year along with the Holly Blue who lays eggs on my holly every year. For the first time in the garden yesterday (3rd August) was a green veined white but I never managed to get a photo! Also spotted were peacocks, small tortoiseshells, red admirals, an orange tip, a gatekeeper and small whites. These butterflies love the hebes and verbenas.

Moving away from butterflies I don't put a lot of food out for the birds as I feel there is a lot of natural food for them, and my neighbours always have plenty of food out for them but this doesn't deter them visiting and nesting. This year I have been a grandmother to great tits, robins, wrens and dunnocks. The tits nested in a nestbox at the side of the summer house with the remainder nesting in the bushes around my very untidy garden and the overgrown clematis on my arch. I currently have two budgies on holiday with me and when they hear the green ring-necked parakeets at the bottom of the garden try calling back to them.

We have three ponds that provide homes for frogs, toads and newts as well as the husbands fish but also dragonflies and damselflies which also haven't been very abundant this year. On a damp night or during the cooling of the day apart from the slugs there are plenty of frogs and toads of all sizes hopping around. With the grass not being cut for 5 years now it provides the baby frogs and toads with shelter and food for the rabbits and guinea pigs I also have on holiday.



#### Cultivating with Clive

In the last issue I wrote about peat free compost and said I would do some trials. Graham at The Hertfordshire Garden Centre gave me various bags of peat free compost. He asked me to do some trials for him which I have now completed and, as they say on Strictly, the results are in!

I am not endorsing any of these products just sharing with you my results. What you must also bear in mind is each year's weather and conditions are very different. This year we had a cold start and Summer was very late arriving. So I will not publish my trials on tomatoes as I personally think they are inconclusive. Mainly because of the weather conditions this year.

I can however share with you my Strawberry trial as Strawberries are native to this country and are not affected that much by the unpredictable British climate.

I used J.Arthur Bower's Multi-Purpose which is a blend of peat, \*West+, lime and fertiliser. 30% peat mix so is 70% peat free.

Westlands Jack's Magic is a blend of peat, \*West+, composted organic matter, lime and fertiliser. 50% peat so is 50% peat free.

Sylva Grow Multi-Purpose The bulk components are fine bark, coir and wood fibre/sawdust it also contains non-organic base fertilisers so is 100% peat free.

\*West+, listed above, is a spruce tree wood, which is chopped up and exploded in a compression chamber to make it fibrous. It is then mixed with carbon before being added into the compost mixes.

In the trial there was not an awful lot of difference however the J. Arthur Bower's and Jack's Magic grew slightly larger plants than the Sylva peat free.

For me, caring for the planet is far more important than the slight improvement on the non-peat free compost.

What I intend to do next season is to do the same trial but adding 50% of my own home made compost to the shop bought compost.







#### Library

Tucked away by the Community Centre in Leverstock Green a team of friendly volunteers run the Library.

Now open on Saturday mornings as well as every weekday afternoon except Thursday. With a fantastic range of fiction and non-fiction books for children and adults, magazines and audiobooks, there is something for everyone.

It's free to join and free to borrow 30 ("How many?? 30?!?") - yes 30 books at a time for up to 3 weeks - and it's free to renew your books unless someone else has reserved them. (It costs less than £1 to reserve a book or to order it from any other library across Hertfordshire.) If you prefer e-books or e-audiobooks, or reading magazines or newspapers online, then library membership also gives you free access to a huge catalogue using the Borrowbox, Libby and PressReader apps.


Printing, using wifi or our library computers, and photocopying is also available in the library for a small fee. During July and August children can enjoy taking part in our Summer Reading Challenge.

#### **Summer Fete**


The Summer Fête, organised by LGVA, is one of the annual highlights of village life.

#### **Buglass Award**

The Fred Buglass Award was instigated in 2002 using funds from the Fred Buglass Legacy. Fred lived in Leverstock Green for 45 years until his death in 1998 at the age of 93. He was responsible for the formation of LGVA in 1962 and served as Chairman and Life President of the Association. He was instrumental in the building of the Village Hall and was awarded the British Empire Medal in 1986 for services to the community. His final act, following his death, was a generous legacy to the Village Association. Fred was largely responsible for

establishing the strong village identity and pleasant environment which we enjoy today. He was deservedly known as 'Mr Leverstock Green'.

Individuals who are eligible for the award must either live or work in Leverstock Green. They can be nominated for making a major contribution to the life of the village community, for promoting the identity of Leverstock Green or making a major contribution towards conserving or improving the environment of the village. The award was initially presented annually although there are some years with no presentation due to a lack of nominations.

At the AGM in November 2023 the award was presented to Lesley Hicks, the Village Hall administrator. Whilst Lesley is a paid employee she devotes a huge amount of additional time to ensure the smooth running of the hall, assisting at fund raising events such as the annual summer fete and even standing in for the caretaker when he is not available. Her contribution to the village goes far beyond her terms of employment and she is a very deserving recipient. Lesley was presented with the award by Clive Hill, editor of the Village Voice.

#### **Leather Bottle**

You may have noticed that the oldest pub in Leverstock Green has recently had a makeover. The pub dates back to approximately 1725. The only history I can find is from the local historian Barbara Chapman's web site. This states that the pub was run by a Mr Arthur Seabrook back in 1883. On his death his widow took over the licence and continued until her retirement. The licence was then transferred to the son in law of Mrs Seabrook Mr Cecil Parkins who was already a resident at the pub because he lived there with his wife Olive who grew up in the pub. Mrs Parkins was also a founder member of the WI.

It is stated on Barbara's website that in the first World War the pub was frequented by many of the Queens Westminster Rifles Regiment who were stationed in Leverstock Green for traing purposes

for the war. It also states that the local Cricket and Football club used to hold there meeting their. They also held there annual dinners in the pub. Also some famous names used to frequent the pub the famous 60s singer Petula Clark and Sir Stanley Rouse who was chairman of the FA.
